 We will increase awareness and understanding of different cultures, religions, and identities through the curriculum, assemblies, and special events.

3. To Eliminate Bullying and Discriminatory Behaviour

We are committed to ensuring that all pupils feel safe, respected, and included, and that incidents of bullying or discrimination are rare and dealt with swiftly.

4. To Increase Participation by Underrepresented Groups

We will encourage and support the involvement of all pupils in school clubs, leadership roles, and enrichment activities, particularly those with SEND, EAL, or from disadvantaged backgrounds.

5. To Ensure Staff Training on Equality and Inclusion

All staff will receive regular training to ensure inclusive classroom practice and raise awareness of unconscious bias, ensuring equality for all pupils.
